This course is an option for healthcare providers seeking an alternative to classroom-based training for first-time or renewal certification.

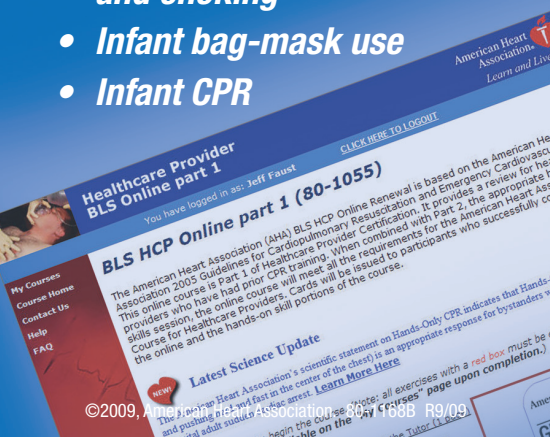
